Rules for Off Highway Vehicles

The following rules are enforced, along with all state laws:

- OHVs are welcome on public County Roads and on redmarked roads shown on the attached map but shall never travel off those roads
- OHVs must be insured to the minimum level required and registered
- Seat belts and eye protection (or a windshield) are required
- OHV occupancy limits must be followed
- Each person under 18 must wear a DOT approved helmet with a chin strap while in motion
- Infants / toddlers must be in child restraint seats if accommodated by the OHV
- All operators and passengers are subject to all traffic laws



To clarify any confusion ~ possession of a valid driver's license is required for any driver on the following roads:

- Deep Creek Road (USFS Rd 550)
- Airport Road (CR 806)
- Deep Creek Rd Cut-off (CR 806B)
- Middle Creek Rd (USFS Rd 523)
 from Hwy 149 to the split of USFS
 Rd 523 and USFS Rd 528

except for the above roads, operators between the ages of 10 and 16 are permitted to operate OHVs on County Roads under the immediate supervision (within direct visual contact) of a person with a valid driver's license.
